MS. EMBREE REPORTED THAT MAP TESTING DATA IS LEADING TO STAFF BEING ABLE TO PLAN FOR STUDENT ACHEIVEMENT AND SET GOALS BASED ON NEEDS. STUDENT ABSENTISM IS BEING ADDRESSED IN THE ALL-CALLS HOME. TRUANCY MEETINGS WITH THE COUNTY PROBATION DEPARTMENT HAVE BEEN TAKING PLACE.

DR. BONN TALKED ABOUT ATTENDANCE BEING A SYSTEMS ISSUE. THAT IT HAS BECOME A SOCIAL NORM TO TAKE FAMILY TRIPS TO WAL-MART DURING THE SCHOOL DAY. THERE HAS NOT BEEN CONSEQUENCES FOR ALLOWING THAT TO HAPPEN. NOW THE COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY IS GOING AFTER ATTENDANCE ISSUES. THEY HAVE SENT OUT WARNING LETTERS. THE PROBLEM IS THAT STAFF IS OVERWHELMED.

DR. BONN ALSO REPORTED THAT HE HAD LEARNED FROM THE LCOE THAT ATTENDANCE FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL ONLY IS REQUIRED TO BE REPORTED 1 TIME A DAY. THE HIGH SCHOOL IS CURRENTLY REPORTING FOR EACH LEARNING PERIOD OF THE DAY (6 TIMES). MS. EMBREE ADDED THAT IT WOULD BE GOOD TO HAVE A SPREADSHEET SHOWING THE AMOUNT OF LOST FUNDING DUE TO ADA WHICH COULD BE TIED TO PROGRAM THE DISTRICT IS NOT ABLE TO FUND.

DR. BONN REPORTED THAT THE DISTRICT LOST \$180,000 LAST YEAR DUE TO ADA.

MRS. GOTCHER LOVED THE POETRY OUTLOUD EVENT. SHE WAS SAD THAT MORE STUDENTS HAD NOT BE INVOLVED. MS. EMBREE RESPONDED THAT SHE AND MRS. PALMER-MARTIN HAVE PLANS TO EXPAND THE EVENT FOR NEXT YEAR.

MR. JOBBINS REPORTED THAT HE HAD ATTENDED A PARENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING. HE SAID THAT HE HAD RECEIVED AN EDUCATION WHICH HE COULD HAVE USED 2 YEARS AGO. HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE MORE PARENTS AND TEACHER GET INVOLVED AS THERE IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO HEAR.

MR. EVERETT REPORTED THAT THE ACCESS TO THE FOOTBALL FIELD FROM TITLE 9 HAS BEEN BLOCKED OFF. A THANK YOU NEEDS TO BE SENT. THE LITTLE TRACTOR NEEDS REPAIRS. HE GAVE A THANK YOU TO MR. PACHECO FOR SNOW PLOWING. HE REQUESTED A MATERIALS LIST TO GIVE TO MR. SCHAFF FOR THE GATE FOR THE FOOTBALL FIELD SO THAT DONATIONS CAN BE REQUESTED.

4.4 Superintendent's Report

DR. BONN REPORED ABOUT THE SCHOOLWORKS PAPERWORK AND APPLICATION. LONG VALLEY CHARTER SCHOOL WILL NOT BE PART OF IT IF THEY DO NOT JOIN THE FORT SAGE DISTRICT.

THERE IS A \$17,000 FINE ARTS GRANT COMING UP AS THE DISTRICT HAS JOINED THE TRI-COUNTY ALLIANCE FOR ART. THE NEW TEACHER IS A GUITAR PLAYER. MRS. PALMER-MARTIN AND MRS. PACHECO WILL WORK ON A LIST OF ITEMS TO ORDER.

THE LOW-PERFORMING BLOCK GRANT WILL FOCUS ON RETEACHING AND RETRAINING. HE IS WORKING ON A PLAN TO SPEND \$4,000. THE PLAN NEEDS TO BE SUBMITTED BY MARCH 1.

THE CSI FUNDING IS APPROXIMATELY \$166,000. THE APPLICATION IS SUBMITED. THE FOCUS IS ON INTERVENTION. HE DOES NOT WANT MORE 1 AND DONE WITH NO FOLLOW-UP TYPE OF TRAINING FOR STAFF.

ADULT EDUCATION IS GOING. HE IS LOOKING FOR WAYS TO EXPAND THE PROGRAM. IDEAS COULD INCLUDE CLASSES TO WRITE RESUMES AS IT IS NORMAL TO PAY \$29,000 FOR SERVICES TO WRITE RESUMES NOW. FEW ARE TRAINING IN HOW TO DO IT. RESUME REVIEW IS BASED ON KEYWORDS. DR. BONN IS TRAINED.
