The public is welcome and encouraged to participate.

Documents

Documents provided to a majority of the Governing Board regarding an open session item on this agenda will be made available for public inspection in the District Office located at 100 D.S. Hall Street, Herlong, California during normal business hours.

Addressing the Board

You may speak on a matter during the time reserved for public comment, after being recognized by the President. The Board will take no action on the matter at this meeting. You may speak on an item on the agenda when that item is being discussed, after being recognized by the President. When there are action items, the Board will make a

motion to approve/disapprove an item, and then open the item for Board discussion. At this time the President will normally recognize those members of the audience who wish to comment. The Board appreciates restricting comments to new ideas or concerns; each comment, once made, should not be repeated by another speaker. The Board is not required to respond to comments.

Complaints

According to district policy # BP 1312.1; complaints are to be addressed by first speaking with the person directly involved. If this does not resolve the issue, the complaint should be submitted in writing to the Superintendent. The Superintendent will investigate and respond in writing or by a phone call. If the issue is still not resolved, a written request for a hearing by the Board may be submitted.

Regular Session

In order to address the Board, please wait for recognition by the President Speakers are expected to be courteous and to avoid any remarks that reflect adversely on the character or motives of any person or on his or her race, religion, or political or economic views. The Board will hear public testimony on any given topic for a maximum of three (3) minutes per person, twenty (20) minutes per

topic. The Board may, by consensus and at its discretion, extend this time limit.

Closed Session

While school board meetings must be open to the public, California law provides for closed sessions which are not open to the public for matters including: when the Board is considering expulsions, suspensions, or disciplinary actions in connection with any pupil, the appointment, employment or dismissal of a public officer or employee, hearing complaints or charges against a public officer or employee, or is discussing aspects of negotiations with employee units or the District's Legal Counsel.

4.3 Superintendent's Report

Report from Janna Acevedo for School Improvement Services

DR. BONN INTRODUCED MS. ACEVEDO WHO WAS AVAILABLE VIA WEBCAM. MS. ACEVEDO REPORTED THAT SHE HAD COME TO VISIT THE DISTRICT AND MET LOTS OF HARD WORKING PEOPLE WHO ARE HUNGRY TO IMPROVE THEIR PRATICE. THEY SEEM TO REALLY WANT WHAT IS BEST FOR KIDS.

MRS. SCHUMACHER ASKED WHAT KEY ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS AND STANDARDS MS. ACEVEDO MIGHT ADDRESS.

MRS. GOTCHER ASKED ABOUT A TIMELINE FOR CHANGE.

MS. ACEVEDO ANSWERED THAT TEACHERS NEED TO UNDERSTAND WHAT ESSENTIAL STANDARDS ARE AND FOCUS ON COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS.

EEI STRATEGIES ARE A WAY TO KEEP IT SIMPLE AND LEVERAGE WHAT WORKS. THAT CAN INCLUDE LEARNING TARGETS, ENGAGEMENT, RETEACHING, AND CLOSURE. NEED TO FOCUS ON LEARNING NOT TEACHING.

IN THE NEXT YEAR, SHE RECOMMENDED FOCUSING ON RTI, BREAKING THE STANDARDS INTO SMALL TARGETS, AND DEVELOPING FORMATIVE ASSESSMENTS. SHE ALSO RECOMMENDED HIRING A CURRICULUM COACH TO BE AT SCHOOL EVERYDAY TO SUPPORT AND MONITOR.

LCAP Update

DR. BONN REPORTED THAT IT IS NOT COMPLETE. THERE ARE 3 GOALS. IT IS ABOUT TAKING LAST YEAR'S DATA AND REPORTING IT. THINGS TO LOOK AT INCLUDE MAKING SURE STUDENTS HAVE ACCESS TO A TO G REQUIREMENTS, THAT ALL TEACHERS ARE CREDENTIALED, AND TO ANALYZE IT. DID IT WORK?

DR. BONN SAID THAT HE LIKES THE LCAP. IT IS A WAY TO PLAN AND EVALUATE. IT IS A PROCESS WITH RECOMMENDATION AND IDEAS WHICH INCLUDE STUDENTS AND PARENTS, TOO.

EDITS NEED TO BE MADE SUCH AS NOT INCLUDING NAMES.

THE CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN IS BEING ADDED TO THE LCAP. NO PLAN MEANS NO SPENDING.

HOW WILL THE DISTRICT FUND SUMMER SCHOOL? PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT? PURCHASE SOFTWARE?

NEED TO KEEP IN MIND THAT DRAFTS ARE NOT FINAL. HE IS LOOKING FOR FEEDBACK AND NEEDS TO INCLUDE PARENTS.

DR. BONN INVITED ALL IN ATTENDANCE TO TAKE A LOOK AT THE TEEN CENTER.

Technology Update

THE E-RATE APPROVAL IS COMPLETE. THE DISTRICT WILL BE GETTING \$80.000 TO IMPROVE THE INFRASTRUCTURE FOR TECHNOLOGY.

Attendance and Enrollment Data

KEEPING STUDENTS IN THE DISTRICT IS IMPORTANT. LOOSE A KID = A \$22,000 LOSS. DR. BONN WOULD LIKE TO START EXIT INTERVIEWS. WHY ARE KIDS LEAVING?

ENROLLMENT IS UP. HOWEVER, WE LIVE IN A .COM SOCIETY. PEOPLE EXPECT THINGS TO BE CUSTOM AND UNIQUE. CHANGE IS DIFFICULT.

MRS. GOTCHER REPORTED THAT SHE ALSO HAD ATTENDED THE BROWN ACT TRAINING.

DR. BONN REMINDED THE BOARD MEMBERS THAT ANOTHER BROWN ACT TRAINING IS COMING UP AT LONG VALLEY CHARTER SCHOOL

MARY FLOYD SHARED THAT 2 OF HER CHILDREN HAD BEEN REMOVED FROM THE SCHOOL BECAUSE THEY WERE BEING PICKED ON BY A TEACHER. 1 MORE OF HER CHILDREN IS BEGINNING TO HAVE TROUBLE NOW. THE NEEDS OF KIDS ARE NOT BEING MET BY THE SCHOOL.

GENE FLOYD SHARED THAT THE DISTRICT REFUSED TO MOVE HIS KIDS TO ANOTHER CLASS. HE SAID THAT THE DISTRICT GAVE THEM THE BOOT. HE IS NOT HAPPY THAT

THE BATHROOM STALL DO NOT HAVE DOORS. THEY ONLY HAVE CURTAINS. THERE IS NO PRIVACY.

ANGEL HUMPHRY SHARED THAT SHE WAS THERE ABOUT AGENDA ITEM 8.1. SHE FELT THAT THE DISCUSSION ABOUT THE CALENDAR NEEDED TO HAPPEN SOONER THAN LATER. SHE WOULD LIKE TO KNOW AND HAVE PARENT COMMUNICATION.

BARBARA LEE SHARED THAT SHE FEELS THAT REPORTS BEING LIMITED TO 3 MINUTES IS INAPPROPRIATE.

KELLY POP BROUGHT STUDENTS WITH HER. THEY BROUGHT A BANNER AND LETTERS. THE LETTERS SHARED THE STUDENTS VIEWS OF THE POSITIVES TO THE SCHOOL YEAR. THEY SET UP A #THANKSDRBONN. THEY LIKED THE HOT WATER AT THE HIGH SCHOOL, DOORS ON THE BATHROOM STALLS, AND THE CHROMEBOOKS.

CASEY WRIGHT SHARED THAT SHE WILL GRADUATE EARLY.

CORI SHERMAN SHARTED THAT SHE HAS 4 STUDENTS. SHE IS CONCERNED ABOUT THE CALENDAR. SUMMERS MEAN VACATIONS, CAMPS, AND VISITING OTHER STUDENTS ON OTHER CALENDARS. WITH TOO MANY BREAKS SHE WORRIES ABOUT LOSS OF FOCUS AND THE ABILITY TO COVER TOPIC. CHILDCARE DURING THE BREAKS WILL BE HARD TO FIND. WHAT ABOUT SPORTS AND SCHEDULING GAMES?

VOTE TO EXTEND THE TIME – MOTION WAS MADE BY JC, SECONDED BY TJ. 4 YES, 0 NO, O ABSTAIN, 1 ABSSENT.

NIKI JOHNSON ASKED WHO IS PAYING FOR THE TEEN CENTER? AS A COACH SHE DOES NOT LIKE THAT KIDS ARE NOT REWARDED OR RECOGNIZED FOR THEIR EFFORTS.
